



The Palm Room with its luxurious nut wood panelling that is so typical of Bayreuth Rococo is most definitely worth a visit.



The Margravial Opera House is considered one of the most beautifully preserved baroque opera houses in Europe. Commissioned by Margravine Wilhelmine the Opera House was built by Giuseppe Galli Bibiena and son, some of the most renowned theatre builders of their time. Measuring 27 metres deep, the stage was the largest in the whole of Germany back in 1871, which was just one of the reasons Richard Wagner was drawn to Bayreuth.


