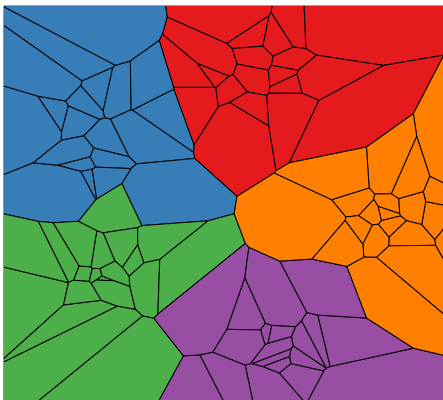
Our Mission

Its main objective is to foster the exchange of methods and the personal contacts between different disciplines as well as to promote the education in the field of data science.

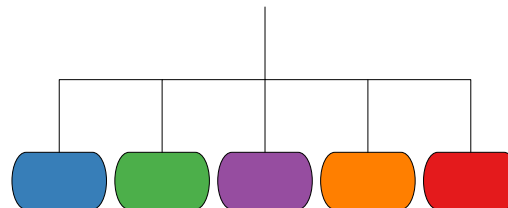


About Us

It was founded to develop research activities related to the classification and ordering of data, to the processing of statistical or conceptual information, and to the construction of databases and information (retrieval) systems.

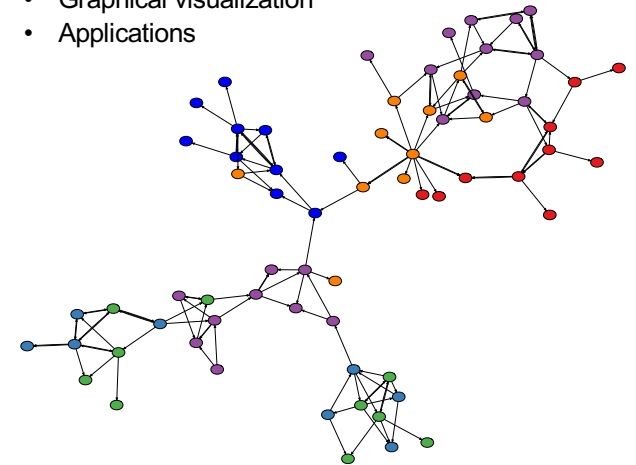
